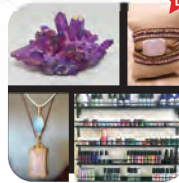

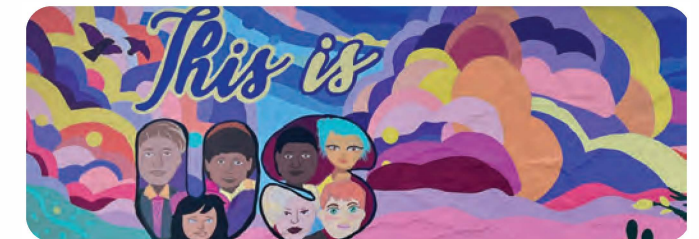

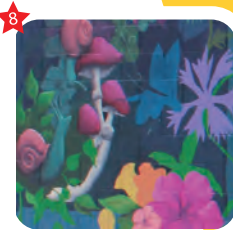

This free, self-guided mural tour allows you to see how Algoma's rich history perfectly blends with the present day.

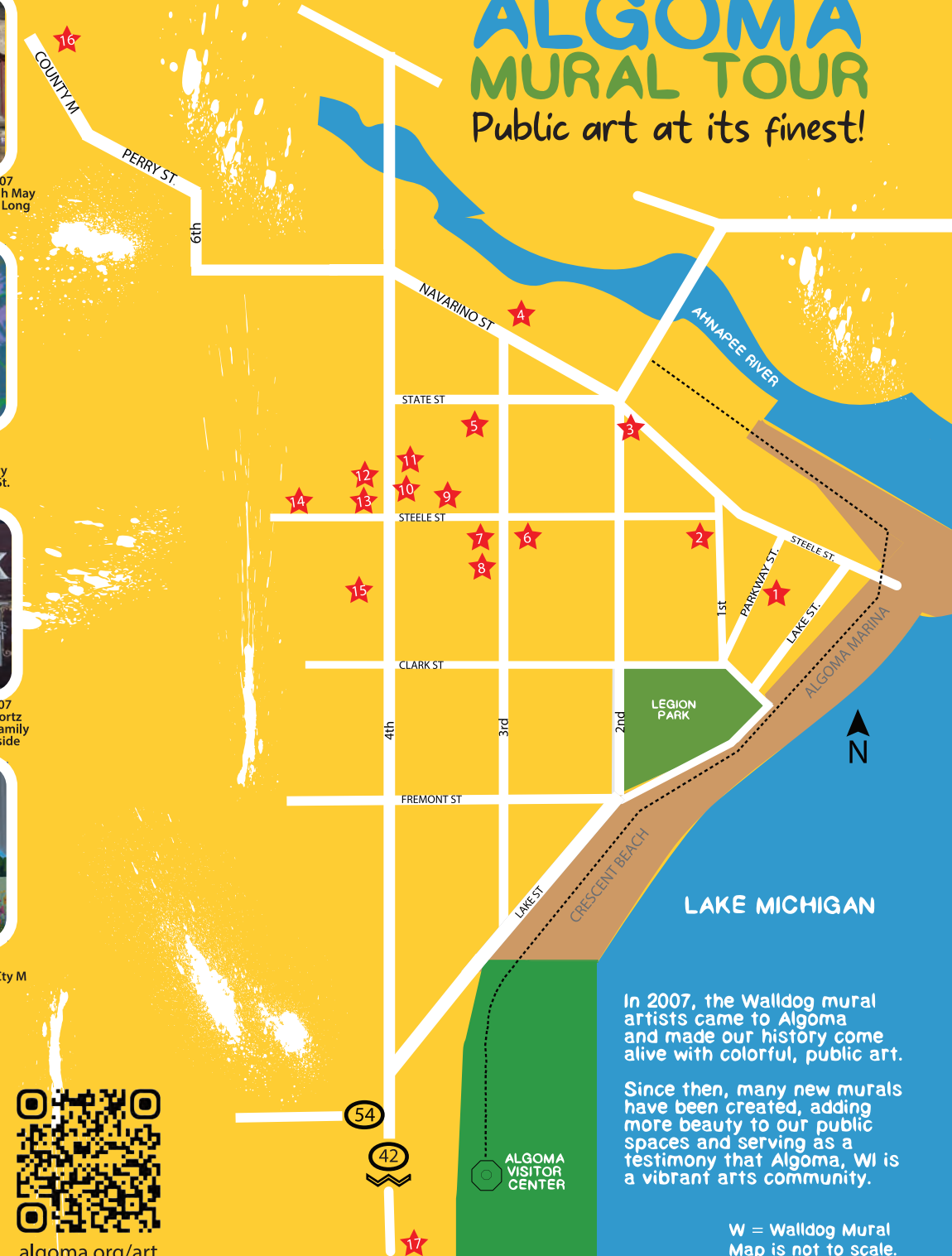
Murals 1 - 15 are located in downtown Algoma within walking distance.
